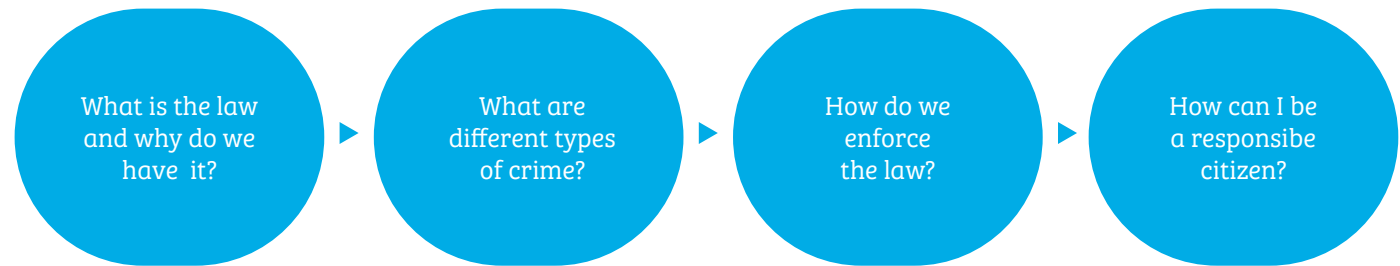


These lessons have been designed to introduce students to the concept and purpose of law and to begin to consider their role within it.

- That laws are created by parliament and must be followed and applied equally by everyone.
- The different roles and powers of the police.
- That there are lots of different types of crime and that no crime is victimless.
